Background



DoD/VA Integrated Mental Health Strategy, #28

- Started 2011; completed in 2016
- Task Group included DoD, Service, and VA experts
- Provided recommendations to VA and DoD MHS leadership to address gaps after comprehensive research, policy, programs, and services reviews related to women's mental health (WMH), both Departments
- Work sustained in DoD through Psychological Health Center of Excellence (PHCoE), J9/Defense Health Agency

Women in Combat Symposium, 2014

- Consortium for Health and Military Performance (CHAMP), USU
- Experts from both operational and medical components participated
- Recommendations passed to policy leads in DoD
- Women at War, 2015 (Ritchie, Naclerio, editors)
- Military Medicine Special Supplement: Women in Combat, 2016



Background



Health Executive Committee (HEC) VA/DoD Women's Health Work Group (WHWG), 2015

- Charter revised and signed 2017
- Purpose: actively collaborate to address growing and unique demands of transitioning Active Duty Servicewomen (ADSW) and women Veterans
- Address delivery of treatment, services, programs, policy, and research related to mental health needs of transitioning ADSWs and women Veterans

WHWG Women's Health Policy Summit, 2016

- Over 50 attendees, subject matter experts, senior leaders in VA/DoD
- Two initiatives were selected for execution in 2017/2018

DoD Women's Mental Health Work Group (WMHWG), 2016

- HEC WHWHG and DoD Women's Health Issues Work Group
- Resourced through PHCoE, meets quarterly
- 2017: DACOWITS liaison request: research gaps for potentially funding



Current efforts



- PHCoE web page, 2016
 - DoD WMHWG identified absence of accurate or easily accessible information related to mental health of military women, to include research
 - Dedicated two webpages on PHCoE's official website: www.pdhealth.mil
- VA/DoD Women's Mental Health Mini Residency
- PHCoE-sponsored RAND study on mental health needs of military minorities, to include women, results pending
