#### Field Artillery:

 First women will attend 13F Advanced Individual Training in November 2017

#### **Special Operations**

- **Special Forces**: 2 officers / 1 enlisted Soldier selected to attend Special Forces Selection and Assessment in March 2017
- Ranger Regiment: 2 officers accepted to attend Ranger Assessment and Selection II in November 2016

# Infantry Basic Officer Leader Course (IBOLC) Graduation Requirements



### **Graduation Requirements**

- 700 Points to Graduate (1,000 Possible)
- Students <u>Must</u> Pass Critical Events\* to Graduate:
  - o Comprehensive Final Exam
  - o Tactical Leadership Assessment
  - o Communicating a Tactical Plan
  - o Final APFT
  - o 5 Mile Run (40 Minutes)
  - o 12 Mile Foot March (3 Hours)
  - o High Physical Demand Tasks
  - o Land Navigation
  - o Rifle Marksmanship

#### \*High Physical Demand Tasks

- Move over 2 meter wall 
  Drag casualty to safety
- Move under direct fire
  Remove cas. from vehicle
- Employ hand grenades
  Prepare fighting position

# Infantry Officer Functional Training (Based on Assignment):

- Bradley Leader (Assigned to Armor Brigade)
- Stryker Leader (Assigned to Stryker Brigade)
- Airborne (assigned to Airborne Brigade)
- Mortar Leader
- Ranger (Voluntary, highly recommended)

- Students must score 70% to progress
