#### **EMPLOYMENT & INTEGRATION**

- 1. Flag Officer Assignment. The Secretary of the Navy Ray Mabus and Chief of Naval Operations Adm. John M. Richardson announced today the following assignment: Rear Adm. (lower half) Shoshana S. Chatfield will be assigned as U.S. Pacific Command representative, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Republic of Palau; commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Marianas; and commander, Joint Region Marianas, Guam. Chatfield is currently serving as deputy U.S. military representative to the NATO Military Committee, Brussels, Belgium.
