Retired Marine Corps Gen. James Mattis appeared before the Senate Armed Services Committee Thursday for his confirmation as the next Secretary of Defense. Here are excerpts from that testimony, and how he'll approach some of the biggest challenges facing the military.

As part of efforts to strengthen the all-volunteer force, Carter announced Dec. 3, 2015, that he had ordered the opening of all military occupations to women, including combat positions. Women have already seen combat in Iraq and Afghanistan -- serving, fighting and, in some cases, making the ultimate sacrifice, he said at the Pentagon announcement. It made sense -- and was backed by years of study -- to open all military occupations to women, he explained.
