### RFI A1

- AFI 36-2002 and AFI 36-2001 regulates recruit applicants' enlistment in regards to joining the military with dependent children
  - No exceptions based on gender of applicant
- Current policy went into effect June 2014 (AD) and at least 12 years (Reserve)
- Methodology
- The change in the dependency policy
  - Positive impact on individuals who desire to enlist in the AF
  - Qualified males/female applicants w/deps on level playing field
  - Opened an opportunity which was previously closed to individuals with children
  - In the past, single individuals with a child were barred from entry. Now a single individual with children (up to 3) may enlist
  - AF (AD) enlisted dependency waivers declined from an average of a little over 100 a year to below 20 (this number includes male/females and single/married)
