Domestic violence, or a pattern of behavior resulting in emotional or psychological abuse, economic control, or interference with personal liberty that is directed toward a person who is a:

- Current or former spouse;
- Person with whom the alleged abuser shares a child in common;
- Current or former intimate partner with whom the alleged abuser shares or has shared a common domicile; or
- Person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the accused and determined to be an intimate partner

- Commanders required to address failure to comply with MPO/CPO.

e. Military Services: Are military authorities required to notify civilian authorities when a military protection order (MPO) is issued?

YES.

Upon receipt of an MPO issued by a commander, the military law enforcement authority will notify civilian authorities electronically, through the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), of the issuance, modification, or cancellation of an MPO per following Navy policy.

f. Military Services: What are the criteria for issuance of an MPO and who has the authority to issue such an order? What is the governing regulation and link thereto?

Navy FAP

- Complete a Safety and Lethality Assessment (SLA) during the initial assessment.
- Evaluate immediate threats to safety of clients.
- Determine if there is risk of immediate harm. If the risk of lethality is moderate or high, FAP should recommend command issue MPO

Commander's criteria for MPO

- Protection of victims of abuse:
- Regulate violent behavior of active duty Service Member.

g. Military Services: How many MPOs have been issued in the last 10 years to safeguard servicewomen?

Military Protective Orders Issued to a Navy or Marine Corps Service Member for the Protection of a Woman, FY21-FY23:

- 1,725 Servicewomen (All Services) Protected Persons
- 765 Civilian Women and Girls Protected Persons
- 1,471 Other Women (Service Affiliation Unknown) Protected Persons

The Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS) provided data for the number of Military Protective Orders (MPOs) issued to Navy and Marine Corps service members and submitted to the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) from FY21-FY23.

As background, the case management system for NCIS, Navy, and Marine Corps Law Enforcement was upgraded in November 2020 to streamline the protective order process and to better collect identifying data for the MPO subject service member and the protected person.

However, the service affiliation of the protected person is not a required field, and therefore in some cases it is unknown if the protected person was a civilian woman or a servicewoman. We included in the response service women, civilian women (includes children), and women with unknown service affiliation.



h. Military Services: What efforts are being undertaken to ensure no dangerous weapons are in a household where both the abuser and victim reside?

Primary Prevention Strategies

- Compliance with Lautenberg Amendment policies and procedures.
- Sailor Assistance & Intercept for Life (SAIL) Program distribution of gun locks at no cost.
- NAVADMIN 263/14 Guidance for Reducing Access to Lethal Means Through Voluntary Storage of Privately Owned Firearms
- Resources on lethal means safety: websites, posters for display, and brochures for distribution.
- Training for FAP personnel includes Lethal Means Safety Counseling, Connecting: Suicide & Family Violence, and Safety & Lethality: Key Research Indicators.
- Mandatory Domestic/Child Abuse Prevention Training for Service Members.
- One Love Escalation of Violence Training for Sailors.

Secondary/Tertiary Prevention Strategies

- COs and health professionals' inquiry about privately-owned firearms, ammunition, or other weapons if there is risk for harm to self or others.
- During crisis, leaders promote voluntary firearm storage in the base armory.
- Compliance with Lautenberg Amendment policies and procedures.
- Timely access to services, including medical care, victim advocacy, counseling, law enforcement, victim witness assistance program information, and chaplain services.
- Issuance of a MPO/CPO.
- Expedited and Safety Transfers.
- Instances of immediate risk to life, rapid action to ensure necessary care and counseling to mitigate the risk of danger to the Sailor or others.



i. Military Services: Identify policies in place and resources available which provide immediate assistance and safe housing for military abuse

FAP Incident Report

- Notifications to law enforcement and command.
- Contact with identified victim and referral for FAP VA services

Assessments completed with clients

- Safety & Lethality Assessment
- Domestic/Child Abuse Risk Assessment Tool
- Victim Advocate Lethality Checklist
- Risk identified as low/moderate/high

High Risk for Violence Coordinated Community Response

- Convened <u>for high-risk</u>
 <u>cases</u> with immediate
 need for intervention
- Situations when life or health of a child is in danger, the commander has the authority to order removal of children from the home without parental consent

Risk Mitigation Strategies Implemented

 May include referrals to domestic violence shelters in community, providing housing on base for service member, assessment with mental health, etc.
